### HEART OF IKEBANA

"When I capture the beauty of a flower, I do not check its name. What I do is to reduce its beauty to colours and lines. According to my theory, you have not produced a good ikebana if you are concerned about the name of the flower......

If you are concerned about the name of the flower, you are not free from the flower. It means that the flowers have been arranged based on common sense. To avoid this, you have to reduce the flower to its colours and lines. If you express freely on this basis, then, you will be able to create an unexpected arrangement that will then lead to a new image."

(The article of which this is a part was written by Victor France in Ikebana International magazine Vol 45, Issue 2, 2000—2001)

"What defines a particular school's choice of container is not so much shape or material, but the relationship with the supplier. Our associations with Sogetsu date back to the time of Sofu Teshigahara, whose studio was located nearby. His preference was for containers that could be suitably placed almost anywhere, and we've evolved to meet that demand."
