With much sadness we wish to let you all know that Florence Rooney passed away recently at the age of 92 years. She had been a very active member for many years and was one of Nora Dyer's first students. They lived nearby in Chapel Hill. She later practised Sogetsu under Mary Brown's tuition. Apart from her active contributions in many exhibitions and displays, she was

a Committee Member from 1986 to 1992. She was a most dignified lady and very kind and thoughtful. She also enjoyed Ikebana Conferences and other activities away from Brisbane when she often shared a room with Molly Thompson and Faye Shanahan. Her husband Wilf was also a great ikebana husband when it came to helping out at exhibitions and assisting her to some out of town activities. She was also very proud of her granddaughter Sian Rooney (swimmer), and was able to attend the Sydney Olympics in 2000 to watch her perform. All those who had the privilege of knowing Florence were enriched by being her friend.

Florence's experience of Sogetsu Ikebana is best illustrated by quoting what she contributed to in "Under the Grass Moon" 2003.

"The literal meaning of ikebana is "living flowers". To me personally, the study of ikebana is a form of meditation. My experience has been to bring myself into spiritual affinity with the flowers and material used to create an arrangement, and to transform that affinity into an expression of my personal feelings and experiences in life. I believe ikebana is the fusion of flowers and/or plants that God created and a human being. My life has been enriched by the spiritual tranquillity gained through the study of Sogetsu Ikebana, and by the many friendships I have formed."
